President's Report

The Annual Report for 2015 is my final report, 10 years after Football Federation South Australia (FFSA) ran its inaugural competition in 2006. That year we moved to the three-tiered competition in what is now the National Premier League (NPL). In the lead up to the kick off that season there had been robust debates, detailed negotiations and lengthy meetings about what the future would hold. Football was in a transitional phase with the National Soccer League, and the South Australia Soccer Federation having ceased activity during 2005. In the first year FFSA had just over 3,000 registered participants, just over \$10,000 in reserves and was operating on a modest establishment grant from the Office of Recreation and Sport. The inaugural President, Trevor Basso, and the first and the interim Directors, volunteered an enormous amount of time in the first year, laying the foundation for a strong organisation which would benefit the whole sport of football.

In the intervening years I have had the pleasure of working with a number of Directors of the organisation who have also volunteered enormous amounts of their time, skill and knowledge for the advancement of football. I have had the pleasure of working with a wide range of people who share a passionate interest in football. Some are focused on the success of their own children; some are focused on the success of their team; some are focused on the success of their club or their branch of football, and others have taken a broader big picture view of what is best for football overall. All of them, in their passion and dedication, have contributed to the advancement of football in this state.

The intervening years have seen much of the football family come together under one umbrella. In addition to running the Men's competition, and the elite junior competitions, from an early stage SAWSA came on board and the FFSA became responsible for Women's football. We were joined by Associations including regional Associations, and later the Collegiate and Masters leagues. In 2015 the FFSA directly coordinated approximately 15,000 matches. In all, there are almost 25,000 registered participants. Football will continue to grow. It is the natural choice of sport for those newly arrived in Australia. At a time when we are the most successful multicultural nation on earth, football can be a uniting force.

With the growth of football, we identified a need for an increase in facilities, so that young players were not turned away from the game. We have worked with governments to provide grant funding for improvements to existing clubs premises.

The establishment of the facility at Burton was a starting point in the direct development of facilities, and from the experiences developed there the excellent practical facilities at The Adelaide Shores and at The Parks emerged, as part of our overarching Football Facility Strategic Plan. We have engaged in an ongoing process



dealing with governments at all levels, which will lead to the development of more high quality venues with artificial pitches able to withstand the vagaries of weather and water shortages, and which will provide a base for clubs to be able to provide a home for the thousands of participants in football, and to deliver football-related programs.

An important part of the role of a peak sporting organisation is the development of programs for talented young footballers, both boys and girls. The performances of the South Australian teams at the national level has been a testament to the success of those programs. The strong performance of our NPL teams at the national level, including in the FFA Cup, are also indicators of the strength of football in South Australia.

We have worked with Futsal SA which contributed greatly by continuing to run that aspect of the game over past years, and we expect to see significant growth in Futsal in the coming years. I also thank Dennis Harlow and the Hall of Fame committee members, and the Museum committee members who are custodians of the history of our game in this State.

Managing our game also involves providing avenues for participation for those who want to participate at a social or community level, for fitness and enjoyment. The facilities that we have developed, and will develop, will make such participation possible.

A crucial component of our game is the availability of independent and trained referees. The programs designed to recruit, and to train and to retain our referees is an important part of the work of the FFSA. Providing training for coaches to improve the experience, and the skills and development of young players is just as important. Increasing the capability and the professionalism of our clubs and associations is also crucial. The move towards fully qualified coaches, and professional administrators or managers, will be seen as a benefit, not a cost, as time goes on. I would like to acknowledge the volunteers in the game who run our associations,

and our clubs, and our supporting organisations. They are the backbone of the sport and although they may do it for love, they do a great service to the sport and to the community.

The management and staff of FFSA, led by Chief Executive Officer Michael Carter, are a very dedicated team of people who have worked selflessly since the establishment of FFSA for the advancement of football. They have shown great vision and ambition for the game, provided great service to the game and to the participants in the game, and have made chairing the organisation a pleasure.

By the time of this report, as is required by the constitution, I and my two remaining fellow interim directors will have retired. New directors will be appointed and new directors will be elected. They will take the reins of an organisation which is in a healthy financial position, which is well placed to further develop and promote our sport, and carry on the tasks of developing facilities and of strengthening our clubs and associations. They will be at the helm of an organisation which enjoys strong relationships with state and local government, with our national federation, with our fellow member federations, and with our partners and sponsors. I thank my fellow directors, present and past, and I look forward to seeing the upward trajectory of our sport in the coming years.

CEO's Report

2015 marks the tenth anniversary of Football Federation SA (FFSA). The major focus has been to establish an organisation that is financially stable, respected, offers a quality experience to its stakeholders and an organisation that has formed strong partnerships with local clubs, associations, corporate partners, the Football Federation Australia (FFA) and all levels of Government. Whilst there are many challenges ahead, a lot has been achieved in the ten years of existence of FFSA.

In 2006 FFSA coordinated competitions internally for approximately 3,000 players. Today we coordinate approximately 15,000 games annually for in excess of 12,000 men, women, girls and boys. Local clubs have welcomed new players to football and have done a fantastic job in providing an environment that encourages participation and a sense of community conducive to future growth.





Financially it has been challenging to ensure that we have had the human resources required to guarantee that a quality service could be provided to our stakeholders whilst confirming the long term viability of the organisation. The Office for Recreation and Sport and FFA have been key partners in providing the necessary funding to ensure that local clubs and associations were not being relied on to fund resources at FFSA. Half of all employees of FFSA are funded through external sources and this has positively impacted on our ability to service our stakeholders. The balance sheet of the organisation looks healthy, however a careful eye will need to be cast to ensure that our financial capacity continues to grow and that will result in future investment in football throughout South Australia.

A key piece of work that was completed in 2011 was the Football Facilities Strategic Plan that has been a guiding tool used by local, state and federal Governments when considering future investment in infrastructure for football in South Australia. Approximately \$11million has been unlocked for Football infrastructure since the plan was released and has resulted in the development of Burton Park, Adelaide Shores, The Parks Football Centre, the Taperoo Primary School site redevelopment and the Kilburn Primary School site earmarked for West Adelaide's new home ground. Football continues to play catch up in terms of the quality and provision of facilities for the code in South Australia. A key focus of FFSA is to continue to build on and create new partnerships and in turn ensure a greater investment in infrastructure for the code is achieved. I am very confident that further developments will result in the near future as a result of the work of clubs and associations and our relationship with local and state governments.

At a competition level the PlayStation 4 National Premier League (NPL) has been introduced for Men and the Women's NPL has been announced for introduction in 2016, the Westfield FFA Cup has been born and the junior competitions have continued to evolve. Futsal has emerged as a sleeping giant and clubs have embraced accreditation of club coaches leading to a better playing experience for participants. Strong links have been forged with regional areas through the introduction of the Regional Round and new clubs have entered the Senior Men's, Women's and Junior Competitions. Football is well positioned to continue to expand and opportunities for players to represent South Australia on the national stage will continue to evolve.

Football is the sport of opportunity at the local, national and international level. The introduction of our Football College to commence in 2016 is a truly exciting opportunity for individuals between 17 and 20 years of age to enter a full time program that focuses on individual player development whilst gaining a dual diploma qualification. The age group mentioned has been identified as having a gap as players exit FFSA high performance programs. Forty eight students have come into the program in year 1 and a future intake will likely see the program double in size in 2017. Opportunities will be offered to girls in 2017 and the program will fast become a great avenue for player development that will directly impact on the quality of players at the local level.

Looking forward, FFSA will shift its focus from start up to focus on development of clubs, associations, education and the promotion of the local competitions offered. A heavy focus on venue infrastructure will continue and maintaining quality partnerships whether corporate or government will ensure that the organisation continues to deliver an improved experience for all involved in football in South Australia.

The 2016 Annual General Meeting will result in the compulsory retirement of three Directors from the FFSA Board - Michael Wright, Oleh Bilyk and President Judge Rauf Soulio. Hall of Fame Member and highly respected Director Ted Iuliano has vacated his Vice Presidency to continue in football at local club level. FFSA will welcome new directors and new opportunities will be created. Stability has been a major positive for the organisation since formation and this has allowed the organisation to develop and grow into one that is financially stable, respected by Government and associated agencies, has built stronger partnerships with local clubs and provides a quality service to players, coaches and match officials. All Directors have contributed a great deal to the organisation and none more than our retiring President who has provided direction, advice, stability and leadership to football in South Australia. Rauf will leave the Board of Directors with an organisation that is in great shape. On behalf of the football family, thank you.





Senior Men's Competition Report

OVERVIEW

2015 saw the conclusion of the current license period for all PlayStation 4 National Premier League and State League clubs. The new license period will commence in 2016 and run until the end of the 2018 season. 2015 also saw the continuation of the National Premier Leagues competition across eight (8) Member Federations with PlayStation 4 being the naming right's partner for the competition across the country. Adelaide United Football Club also competed in the State League competition fielding Senior and Reserve Grade teams while the South Australian National Training Centre (SA NTC) competed in the Under 18 competition.

PLAYSTATION 4 NATIONAL PREMIER LEAGUE AND STATE LEAGUE COMPETITIONS



The thirty (30) Senior Men's Clubs competed across two divisions; fourteen (14) teams competing in the Play-Station 4 National Premier League (NPL), with sixteen (16) teams competing in the State League. As in previous years all teams participating in the PlayStation 4 NPL and State League were required to field a Senior, Reserve and Under 18 team in the competitions.

In the PlayStation 4 NPL, 26 rounds of home and away fixtures were played. At the conclusion of the home and away season, West Adelaide claimed the league premiership with the last kick of the league competition as Pirates held Adelaide Blue Eagles to a stunning draw through a 94th minute equaliser. As a consequence of their success, West Adelaide won the right to represent South Australia in the PlayStation 4 NPL Final Series.

As League Premiers, West Adelaide headed into the South Australia PlayStation 4 NPL Final Series as a clear favourite. The format of the Final Series provided the top six teams with an opportunity to contest the finals, as outlined below.

The conclusion of the Finals Series culminated in Adelaide Blue Eagles and title favourites West Adelaide contesting the Grand Final. As with finals, favouritism counts for very little in a one off game. Adelaide Blue Eagles had previously defeated West Adelaide 4 goals to 1 to win their way into the Grand Final, giving them an edge leading into the final game of the season. West Adelaide dominated the Grand Final by defeating Adelaide Blue Eagles 4 goals to 2 being crowned PlayStation 4 NPL SA Champions in front of 2,600 spectators at Elite Systems Football Centre.

In the State League, 16 teams contested a 30 week home and away season with the top team gaining automatic promotion into the PlaySstation4 NPL for 2016. A Play-Off series was also introduced in 2015 to determine the second promotion spot into the NPL for 2016 with the second (2nd) placed team from the State League playing against the eleventh (11th) placed team from the PlayStation 4 NPL in a two (2) leg home and away play-off.

At the conclusion of the home and away season, Adelaide United were crowned champions of the State League and gained promotion into the PlayStation 4 NPL for 2016 on the last day of the season. The title was decided through a stunning draw between Cumberland United and Adelaide Hills Hawks. The 'Hawks' scored in stoppage time to seal a draw, which saw Cumberland United drop to third with Adelaide Olympic gaining second spot and the play-off position for the PlayStation 4 NPL.

The Play-Off series was conducted over two weeks with the first leg finishing in a one (1) all draw with Adelaide Olympic dominating the second leg, winning the game four (4) - nil (0). Adelaide Olympic gained promotion with a aggregate score of five (5) - one (1).

The 2015 season saw a total of 1,100 fixtures played across all competitions throughout the season.

REGIONAL ROUND

FFSA continued the Regional Round initiative launched in 2013 with three (3) games being conducted across three regional areas. The games were conducted in Whyalla, Mount Gambier and Roxby Downs.

Whyalla played host to Modbury Jets and Raiders, Mount Gambier hosted current PlayStation 4 NPL National Champions MetroStars and Adelaide City and Roxby Downs hosted West Torrens Birkalla and Adelaide Comets with all matches being played across the month of March to increase the coverage and profile of the PlayStation 4 NPL clubs in regional areas. In addition to the match day events, FFSA conducted a number of Game Development Clinics at schools and clubs to promote and expand football in regional South Australia.

PLAYSTATION 4 NPL NATIONAL FINALS SERIES

As South Australia's NPL League Premiers, West Adelaide won the right to represent South Australia in the PlayStation 4 NPL National Finals Series.

Going into the PlayStation 4 NPL Final Series West Adelaide first elimination match was against Bayswater SC (Football West) at Adelaide Shores Football Centre. West Adelaide began the game dominantly and took an earlier lead within 12 minutes, which they held going into the half-time break. Bayswater showed their intent after the half-time break and had a number of near misses. Bayswater finally equalised in the 77th and then shattered the hopes of West Adelaide with a second goal in the 80th minute. Bayswater held on to defeat West Adelaide two (2) - one (1)

WESTFIELD FFA CUP (WFFA CUP)

2015 saw the full implementation of the Westfield FFA Cup that included each Member Federation conducting the preliminary rounds of the WFFA Cup competition. It was determined that the winner of the WFFA Cup Preliminary Rounds SA would also be crowned FFSA Federation Cup Champions.

The competition commenced in February and culminated in June in a hotly contested final between 2014 Cup Winners, Adelaide City and 2014 League Champions Croydon Kings. Croydon Kings defeated Adelaide City two (2) - nil (0) at Elite Systems Football Centre.

As Champions of the 2015 WFFA Cup Preliminary Rounds SA, Croydon Kings joined South Australia's other representative MetroStars, who gained entry as reigning PlayStation 4 NPL National Champions, in the Round of 32.

MetroStars first match was away to NSW PlayStation 4 NPL side Blacktown City, who headed into the match as strong favourites. MetroStars went into the half time break down one (1) - nil (0) before coming back to defeat Blacktown by a score of two (2) - one (1). In the other Round of 32 match Croydon Kings were drawn against Brisbane Premier League side Lions FC played at Elite Systems Football Centre in front of a crowd of 1,000. Lions opened the scoring before leading two (2) - nil (0) at the break. Croydon pressed hard and were rewarded by a goal late in the match; unfortunately it was not enough and Croydon were defeated two (2) - one (1).

MetroStars Round of 16 matches was against Victoria side Oakleigh Cannons in front of over 1,200 spectators at Elite Systems Football Centre. MetroStars were defeated by a solitary goal, the score of one (1) goal to nil (0).

NEW LICENCE PERIOD

In 2016 FFSA will enter into a new three year licence period for the Senior Men's Competition and the PlayStation 4 National Premier League. The new license period will see the establishment of a third division competition and the alignment of the PlayStation 4 NPL and State League 1 competition to twelve (12) teams in each division. The creation of the State League 2 will provide a pathway to clubs who are not affiliated with FFSA to enter the competitions. In 2016 the competition will see the entry of three (3) new clubs, being Fulham United, Mount Barker and Vipers FC.

The competition structure will consist of the following;

PlayStation 4 National Premier League - 12 Teams State League 1 - 12 Teams State League 2 - 9 Teams

Promotion and relegation will occur across all three competitions. In the PlayStation 4 NPL two teams (12th and 11th Place) will be relegated to State League 1 with the League Premier and League Champion of State League 1 gaining promotion to PlayStation 4 NPL. Promotion and relegation from State League 1 to State League 2 competition will consist of one team automatically being relegated from State League 1 (12th Place) with the League Champion of State League 2 gaining promotion into State League 1. The second placed team of State League 2 will play-off against the 11th placed team of State League 1 to determine the final promotion/relegation spot.

COMPETITION MANAGEMENT

During 2015 there were a number of key initiatives introduced into the competition with an aim to improve the standard of competition management. The initiatives focused on areas such as Club Governance and Development and Competition Management.

The initiatives launched included the increased usage of the competition management system FoxSports Pulse which saw the introduction of electronic team sheets across all FFSA competitions, this provided clubs with an opportunity to select their teams via the system and print a copy of the team sheet including all of the player's information prior to the match day. The implementation of online team sheets was initiated to reduce the workload of club volunteers.

FoxSports Pulse was also utilised to collate the match results for all senior competitions, with the Match Officials being responsible for entering all scores and player data at the conclusion of the senior grade fixture. This ensured that the information provided to media outlets and available on the website was accurate and provided within 60 minutes of the game being played.

Player registration during 2015 was transitioned to self registration for all Senior Men's competitions utilising the MyFootball Club self registration system. As part of the transition FFSA conducted player and club education sessions to train clubs and educate players in the usage of the MyFootball Club System.

The player education sessions also had a focus on educating players on other key facets of the sport which included topics such as; Anti-Doping, Betting in Sport, Social Media usage and Codes of Conduct.

To further enhance Club Governance and Development, the National Club Accreditation Scheme continues to be rolled out to clubs. All Senior Men's clubs have been awarded level 1 NCAS accreditation with clubs now working towards level 2 NCAS accreditation, all clubs are expected to complete and submit the Level 2 by the end of 2015. In addition to the NCAS, FFSA has implemented a 'Traffic Light' assessment which is designed to assist clubs to undertake a health check of their club as part of the Elite Club Licensing Structure. The review will be conducted annually through face-to-face meetings with each PlayStation 4 NPL club with a copy provided prior to the commencement of the next season to allow time for implementation.

Girls & Women's Competitions 2015

2015 saw a large increase in team numbers for all Girls and Women's competitions from elite, community, collegiate and junior leagues. Metro United Women's Football Club claimed the Women's Premier League and Cup double topping off their 10th Anniversary celebrations. The League and Cup double didn't come easy for Metro United, claiming the League title in the final round of the season against arch rivals, Adelaide City. Metro United's success continued in the Reserve competition, where they again edged out Adelaide City for the top spot.



A competitive Women's Premier League competition and FFSA's Elite Pathways's provided a solid base for players to be selected into the Lady Reds Westfield W-League squad for season 2015/16. To date, the season has had some outstanding highlights under the guidance of Jamie Harnwell. The Lady Reds are aiming to gain a finals birth for the first time.

The Women's Community and Junior Girls divisions saw yet another consistent year of growth with participation numbers and teams increasing across all divisions and age groups. Participation numbers in the Women's game have shown a steady rise and FFSA value the role of clubs in fostering the growth of the game.

The Girls AIA Vitality MiniRoos leagues have also continued to grow showing that football is increasing in popularity with young females in South Australia. FFSA sees this age group as vital in the growth and development of the sport and will continue to focus on the development of Girls AIA Vitality MiniRoos to encourage participation numbers at this grassroots level.

Individuals were recognised for outstanding achievements during the 2015 Celebration of Football, where all facets of the football family were recognised on the evening.



Junior Competitions 2015

Competitions – Junior Premier League, Junior State League, AIA Vitality MiniRoos & The Parks Junior Futsal

The 2015 season was once again successful most notably with the continued growth in Junior football and futsal, in particular at the community level of the game.

The Junior Premier League gained 2 additional teams, taking the tally to 143 teams competing in 2015. The Junior State League and AIA Vitality MiniRoos programs both experienced an increase in team participation from the previous season. In 2014 a total of 79 teams participated in the Junior State League while in 2015 an additional 17 teams took to the pitch totalling 96 teams. The AIA Vitality MiniRoos team participation increased remarkably with an additional 36 teams this season, resulting in 310 teams being involved in AIA Vitality MiniRoos for 2015.

Across all Junior competitions there has been a total increase of 54 teams from AIA Vitality MiniRoos through to U17's which relates to 549 Junior teams competing across 59 leagues at 37 clubs on a weekly basis from March through to September. This large number of teams would not be able to get onto the pitch without the dedication and commitment of volunteers. The contribution of volunteers can go unnoticed at times, but each individual club volunteer ensures that Football Federation SA (FFSA) can conduct Junior competitions for all participants. FFSA would like to offer our appreciation and say thank you to all volunteers throughout the sport that make the delivery of our game possible.

Manchester United Premier Cup

The Junior season commenced as in previous seasons with the Manchester United Premier Cup for U15 boys, being fiercely contested over the March Long Weekend. The 2015 edition witnessed a total of nineteen teams participate in the tournament, with the reward to the winners a place to represent South Australia in Sydney at the Pacific Finals.

The final came down to West Adelaide, one of the pre-tournament favourites, against somewhat of a surprise package in Western Strikers. In an extremely tight contest West Adelaide defeated Western Strikers narrowly by 1 goal to nil via a penalty converted by Andrew Koutroumbis.

West Adelaide travelled to Sydney in late May where unfortunately they did not progress out of the group stage. Eventual winners Football NSW Institute's Under 15 squad went on to be one of the teams who earned the opportunity for a once in a lifetime experience to represent Australia and New Zealand on the World Stage.

Junior Premier and Junior State League

The Junior Premier and Junior State Leagues were once again exciting, full of goals and the brand and level of football on display continues to develop year on year. A greater number of children continue to decide that football is their sport of choice, thus the increase to 25 leagues in the JPL and JSL alone speaks volumes for the demand of children to play our sport and to imitate their heroes.

Junior Cup Competitions

The 2015 Junior Cup Finals were held on Sunday 16 August at Elite Systems Football Centre. A crowd of 1,585 across the day witnessed exciting football with numerous goals scored in perfect conditions. The Junior Cup competition continues to provide the challenge for Junior State League teams to test themselves against those Junior Premier League outfits.

Junior Football, Senior Football & Futsal

The importance of the Junior teams of a club cannot be taken for granted, as the transition between Junior and Senior football continues to occur at an even younger age than in years gone by. Junior teams continue to underpin most notably the U18's and Reserves and to some degree the Senior team. Opportunities for players to gain invaluable experience at a Senior level and clubs to promote Juniors to the Senior setup is encouraging to witness and will in the long term raise the standard of football in the state.

A vast number of both Senior but most notably Junior players are also continuing to develop their game through playing futsal. Futsal is a highly skilled game and a great development tool for those who wish to participate in the outdoor game as well, another aspect that will raise the standard of football here in South Australia.

Futsal

Futsal has been identified by Football Federation Australia (FFA) and FFSA as a priority for the development of players and a major contributor to the future participation growth in Football nationally and within the state of South Australia.

2015 observed several important developments in regards to futsal in South Australia. The affiliation of Futsal Providers has proved FFSA is committed to participation growth and offering all players with the same opportunity to represent South Australia at National Championships. To ensure that participation numbers increase and those players have the opportunity to be selected for state representative teams, the FFSA will offer affiliation to all Futsal competition providers operating in South Australia.

An affiliation fee of \$25 per player has been set and offered to all competition administrators for Futsal in the State. The fee covers the National Registration Fee, offer Player Insurance and affiliation to the FFSA. Only players who are registered with the FFSA will be eligible for state selection as is the case with the outdoor game.

There is no doubt that Futsal SA have been the pioneer of the game in the State and FFSA is pleased that Futsal SA will continue to run competitions in their zone and offer participant opportunities. FFSA acknowledges the work Futsal SA has undertaken in the development of Futsal in South Australia and we thank Arthur Di Fede, Tony La Scala and the committee for their commitment to Futsal.



FUTSAL COMPETITIONS

The Parks Recreation Centre Junior Futsal Competition

As with the outdoor game futsal participation continues to grow and grow. This is evident through FFSA's futsal competition held at The Parks Recreation Centre between October and December.

In 2014 a total of 14 teams participated in the competition, this year it has more than doubled with 35 teams currently involved in the competition at The Parks. The competition is for boys and girls from U10's through to U19's with a total of 245 players involved.

Futsal SA Competitions

Futsal SA continue to run competitions in the east, this year with the redevelopment of Campbelltown Leisure Centre temporary homes have been found at Turramurra Recreation Centre, St Francis of Assisi School and Uni SA's Magill Campus. Over 50 teams currently compete in Juniors, Women's and Men's competitions with over 325 players participating.

South Australian Futsal League

The South Australian Futsal League (SAFL) has continued to expand its competitions. Based at the Velodrome at Gepps Cross in Adelaide's north, SAFL currently caters for juniors women's, and senior men with over 70 teams competing at present.

SA Futsal Fury

SA Futsal this year have been conducting its competitions at Westminster School, south of the CBD. With over 100 players in almost 20 teams competing across 3 leagues for boys and girls it is a great starting point for years to come.

Jamestown

Jamestown Strike Futsal continues to go from strength to strength. In 2015 a total of 28 teams across boys, girls, women's and men competed on a weekly basis at the 'Big Shed' in Jamestown. Over 200 players from across the mid north of the state participated in futsal in Jamestown.

Futsal State Team Process Confirmed

Football Federation SA is pleased to confirm that state representative teams participating in the National Futsal Championships in NSW in January 2016 and beyond will be administered and managed by the FFSA. The highly respected FFSA Game Development Officer, Cristiano Dos Santos will be appointed the State Futsal Director of Coaching and will select, mentor and guide all Futsal Coaches in the lead up to and at National Championships.

Country Championships

The inaugural Country Futsal Championships were held Saturday 26 September 2015 at the Central Oval Community Sporting Hub in Port Augusta with 17 teams participating across the day. Over 150 kids filled the sides from Port Pirie, Jamestown, Roxby Downs, Port Augusta Futsal, Adelaide Hills and FFSA Futsal Academies.

A total of 41 games were played across 3 courts at the brilliant new facility in Port Augusta. The championships provided children from a variety of locations throughout SA the opportunity to showcase their talent and potential in front of State coaches and against opposition they have never come across previously.

In addition, several referees from Jamestown and Port Augusta Futsal were instructed by State Futsal Referee Coordinators Andrew Murray and James Lesicar across the Championships to further develop and provide opportunities to referees in regional areas.

State Championships

The State Futsal Talent Identification Championships (SFTIC) were held on Saturday 10 and Sunday 11 October 2015 for boys and girls aged between 12 and 19 years. Games were played at 3 futsal centres across Adelaide including The Parks Recreation Centre, Parafield Gardens and Ingle Farm Recreation Centre.

Over 240 children participated and contested 91 games, including several Country Select players who were identified in Port Augusta at the recent Country State Futsal Talent Identification Championships. There were many talented players from across the state which made the coaches job extremely difficult in selecting a squad of 20 players to trial.

Six Country players were identified to continue to trial for the opportunity to represent South Australia at the Futsal Nationals in Sydney in January. This year has been a first for the Country and State Futsal Talent Identification Championships and aids the process of identifying talented players the opportunity to be selected to represent their State.

Nationals

The nationals are fast approaching and for the first time in 2016, FFSA will send 11 teams from U12's through to U19's both boys & girls as well as a team from Inclusive Sport SA who will send one team away.

Congratulations to those players who have been selected to represent South Australia in Sydney at the FFA Futsal Nations between 4th – 8th January 2016.

Football Championships Adelaide 2015

For the first time in many years both Primary Schools (U12 Years) and Secondary Schools (U19 Years) State Championships were held at the same time and same venue. Five playing grounds at Adelaide Shores Football Centre, West Beach, were featured, including the new synthetic pitch, for both Boys and Girls teams from November 22 - 28. Though a little warm at times, it was a great week that provided lots of excitement, competition, goodwill and budding talent. Competitors and team management must be congratulated for their co-operation, assistance and good will during the enthralling week.

For the first time ever, these Championships were part of the Pacific School Games (PSG), an International sporting event for school students aged 10-19 years, featuring nine different sports, scattered throughout Adelaide and held in the same week. Most states and a number of overseas teams were represented.

Formal trials for all SA teams, both Girls and Boys commenced early in the year and continued every week until the final squads were finally selected. Trial games against competitive teams were then added to the equation. Selection was generally based on individuals that were team players with skill, positive character and commitment.

All SA squad members, both Boys and Girls, at both Primary and Secondary levels, were provided with opportunities to compete and express themselves against the best Primary/Secondary school players throughout Australia. As is normal practice, the squad members were rotated during the week to be provided with equal playing time, thus sharing the workload and getting adequate chances to express themselves.

At the end of the hectic but challenging week all SA sides came away with positive experiences and good memories, though not necessarily reflected in the final results. The Girls U12 team finished sixth, the Boys U12 team was our best placed outfit finishing the week in equal top position. They played entertaining, free-flowing & creative football that enabled them to score 10 more goals than their nearest opposition.

At the U19 level we struggled at times but when things fell into place our teams looked promising. The Girls played some entertaining football but were unable to capitalise at vital moments in the games. The Boys started the week with a late injury to a key player that kept him out for the entire week. The team played competitively throughout the week with team officials stating that team results were not reflective of their performance. In many games the team created numerous opportunities that were not converted. It's fair to say that an ounce of luck, when needed, wasn't forthcoming. They finished the week in fifth place, as did the Girls.

An Australian squad and a Shadows squad were selected at U19 level. Sarah Chappel was selected in the National Australian Schoolgirls team. This was Sarah's third Championship and is an extremely deserving inclusion, after being selected in the Shadow team last year. Alison Atkins was selected in the Shadow team. This also was Ali's third Championship. It's great to see these girls get the recognition they deserve for their hard work.

There were also some excellent individual performances from the U19 Boys, including those from Aladin Irabona, Ben Head, Jamie Recchia and Damian Canala. Ben Head was selected in the Australian squad and Aladin Irabona was selected in the Shadow squad.

Both individually, and as a group, the SA players were excellent ambassadors for their state, schools, clubs and families. They showed that SA has a great crop of budding stars. Hopefully their development continues to flourish so that we get to see and appreciate their skills at both Club and representative levels at a time not too far away!

The 2015 Season was another successful one for the competition. The league now comprises 24 teams which allowed for a new format for the competition. The Executive and team delegates continue to give the Competition great support. Overall meetings were well attended by team delegates. The important role of team delegates cannot be underestimated and given the voluntary nature of the role, delegates discharged their functions admirably. Office holders also discharged their role responsibly and with enthusiasm.

It is pleasing to note that the Disciplinary Committee did not have cause to meet in 2015. Players were suspended during the season for an accumulation of disciplinary points. One team had League points deducted as a result of its players accruing sufficient disciplinary points to warrant a sanction under the competition rules. The Fair Play Code continues to be applied and generally accepted by players.

During the latter stage of the season one team in division 1, Lion United folded which resulted in a number of matches being forfeited.

DIVISION ONE

This division again produced many high standard games. West Beach were crowned Champions for a second consecutive season ahead of Cove United. College and Lion United were relegated.

DIVISION TWO

White Hart in its first season prevailed after the season long battle with Phoenix who finished runner-up. It was a keen competition and final places were not decided until the concluding rounds of matches. Whyalla and Adelaide Spartans were relegated.

DIVISION THREE

West Beach Legends emerged as Champions ahead of Monarchs. This victory reflected the overall strength of the West Beach club in winning the division 1 and 3 competitions. Adelaide Spurs finished in last place.

SUMMARY

The season was very successful on and off the field. The League entered into a sponsorship arrangement with VIV Sports to obtain a variety of materials for teams and the Competition. The Competition remains in a strong financial position and is actively supported by team delegates. New teams continue to show an interest in joining the Competition.

SAJSA Report 2015

2015 was a successful year for the South Australian Junior Soccer Association (SAJSA). Once again the two Championships were conducted attracting strong teams with the competition being very competitive. The State Championship attracted 46 teams and again the winning Associations were evenly distributed.

The Country Championships were held in the Riverland this year and had to be relocated late in the year from Barmera to Renmark due to a lack of pitches.

Riverland put on a very well run event and even provided 2 pitches with lights which allowed 4 night games to be played. Having this facility, which was thoroughly enjoyed by the 8 teams and spectators, made sure that the number of games required to be played across the 2 days could be completed.

56 teams entered this event including for the first time 2 teams from Roxby Downs. Having this number can cause problems with the fixtures depending on the numbers in an age group causing a round robin rather than 2 divisions

At the General Meeting the members voted for Adelaide Hills to be awarded the 2016 Country Championships and it will be held in Strathalbyn, 27th and 28th August, utilising 9 pitches to alleviate fixture problems.

Finally the Associations voted to change the concept in 2017 to try and negate any future problems.

They voted to hold the Country Championships during the June long weekend over 3 days and the State Championships in late August.

This decision has been based upon the number of teams entered for both events during the last four years and will be trialled for 1 year.

The first 3 day Country Championships has been awarded to Whyalla JSC, in 2017, and the State will still be at Barrett Reserve West Beach.



Referee's Report

Season 2015 was a challenging year for refereeing in South Australia, but it also brought some great personal achievement for South Australian match officials locally, nationally, and internationally. The developmental achievement of referees in South Australia shows our state's ability to produce top-class match officials.

Football Federation SA (FFSA) experienced a 7% decline in match official numbers across the state in 2015, with 275 registered match officials. This presented a number of challenges for the sport, in particular the coverage of matches. In order to combat this, FFSA developed a Club Referee Program which consisted of a 2 hour education session for club-based volunteers to enable clubs to provide competent and confident people when a FFSA match official was unable to be provided. This Program was embraced by the Football community and over 60 volunteers received referee training over 2 sessions, with some continuing with this education to a Level 4 Referee course and receiving referee accreditation. Their continued support and commitment to their club and the sport is greatly appreciated and should be recognised by the whole community.

FFSA match officials continued to service a number of Competitions in 2015. In addition to FFSA administered competitions, match officials also serviced matches for Collegiate Soccer League, SA Masters League, School Sports SA, African Nations Cup, Australian Masters Games, and Western Border Soccer Association. FFSA thanks those affiliated competitions for their support of refereeing and their keen interest in ensuring its continued growth.

National Referee Training Programs continued to be delivered across the state, including metropolitan Adelaide, Adelaide Hills, and Mt Gambier. A total of 72 referees participated in a Level 4 Referee course, while 38 existing match officials upgraded their accreditation, furthering their own knowledge and education. This increased knowledge allows these match officials to further their skills and continue to improve, providing the sport with increased officiating standards.

APPOINTMENTS AND SELECTION Pacific School Games – Adelaide, 21-29 November

FFSA had 3 referees (Maddison Kennedy, Isabella Blaess, Jarrod Muller) selected by FFA to participate in the Pacific School Games. All three performed very well with Isabella Blaess (Female competition) and Jarrod Muller (Male competition) finishing the week both ranked 1st in their respective groups.

FFA NTC (Boys) Challenge - Canberra, 30 November-4 December

FFSA had 2 referees (Aaron Galanti and Samuel Kuys) selected by FFA to participate in the NTC Boys Challenge in Canberra. Samuel was ranked 1st following the tournament.

Westfield W-League 2015/16 Season - Semi Final

Isabella Blaess was appointed to the W-League Semi Final between Melbourne City and Brisbane Roar. This was Isabella's first Semi Final appointment and was achieved in her first year on the National Match Official Panel.

Game Development Manager's Report

MULTICULTURAL ENGAGEMENT

Football Federation SA (FFSA) Game Development staff are continually focused on developing strong partnerships with Local Council and Government Agencies in the pursuit of excellence in the delivery of quality football programs to multicultural communities. A strong focus has been placed on increasing participation within New Arrivals, Refugees and Asylum seekers through the delivery of educational and health based programs to students with strong multicultural backgrounds and through delivered football programs within multicultural communities.

In March 2015, FFSA were presented with the prestigious Governor's Multicultural Award as Winners of the best 'Community Sector Organisation'. The award was presented by His Excellency the Governor the Honourable Hieu Van Le AO at Government House Adelaide. FFSA Chief Executive Officer Michael Carter stated that the award is due recognition for the work of the FFSA Game Development staff and FFSA organisation as a whole. "Resources provided by the Office for Recreation and Sport through the SRDIP Program have been an integral reason for receiving the Governor's Multicultural Award. Football is the sport of choice for many new arrivals and culturally diverse communities and the development team at FFSA do a great job in providing participation and educational opportunities for individuals of all ages and abilities."

FFSA Game Development staff in conjunction with The City of Port Adelaide Enfield Council continued their multicultural work at the annual Harmony Day event. Harmony Day is held every year on 21 March to coincide with the United Nations International Day for the Elimination of Racial Discrimination and sees junior football players engage in a day of football fun along with recognising cultural respect for everyone who calls Australia home.

Popular events and programs have also included the well supported African Nations Cup tournament, the Rajah Street Reserve after-school program which assists over 30 disadvantaged children in the area and the indigenous football program that focuses on game training and life skills development with participation from the Wiltja Residence, along with the Two Halves program that was held in various schools.



REGIONAL PROGRAM

The Regional program is a pathway for girls and boys located in regional and geographically isolated areas. Girls and boys are provided the opportunity for training, coach education and referee education and have the opportunity to be selected to take part in an International Tournament in Fiji in December that is also supported by NSW Country and Victoria Country State teams. SA took away an U15 and U17 girls teams as well as an U13 boys team.

This pathway has already seen girls progress to our National Training Centre (NTC) Program and also the Westfield W-League squad.

REGIONAL CAMP

FFSA held the Annual Regional Camp for Boys and Girls in Berri, Riverland from 6-10 July.

The Camp was established in relation to the FFSA Regional Program - a pathway for Coach's and players located in regional and geographically isolated areas of South Australia. Junior players are provided with the opportunity for training, coach education and referee education. A total of 20 girls and 28 boys were in attendance for the 2015 camp.

FFSA Development Officers Tiarn Powell and Cristiano Dos Santos along with James Kerr (Adelaide Hills), Tony D'Agostino (Inter, Mount Gambier) and Shannon Neilson (Whyalla Wanderers), conducted a variety of sessions throughout the week.

Game Development Manager John Mundy commented on the success of the camp.

"It was impressive how the Coach's from the Country areas embraced our philosophy and quickly gained the respect of the players. In the couple of days I attended, the improvement of the players was also evident."

These players then became eligible for selection for squads taking part in an international tournament in Fiji in December. FFSA took an Under 15 and U17 girl's team and an U13 boy's team for the 2015 tournament.

FIJI CUP

The Ultimate Fiji Cup was a success, with an U15 and U17 Regional Girls side and Under 13 Regional Boys side representing South Australia.

Day 1 of the Ultimate Fiji Cup started with the opening ceremony with the Fijian Prime Minister in attendance at the Fiji National Training Centre in Ba.

After the ceremony concluded a full day of games began with the U17 and 15 Girls to play NSW first up with the U13 Boys to play two matches against Fiji South and Fiji West with the day providing some mixed results from the SA Teams



The U17 Girls persevered through a lot of early pressure from NSW to head into the half time break nil all. After the break the girls came out firing and were having their fair share of opportunities without any impact on the score sheet. With ten minutes to play NSW scored on the counter and stuck again five minutes later to see the final score 2-0 to NSW after a tightly contested battle. The U17's had a rest day which saw them recover and prepare for the tough test of facing Fiji West on the Wednesday of the competition.

After playing NSW twice previously in the pre-tournament competition the U15 girls again engaged in a hard fought match, the girls starting strongly and creating many chances but being unable to find the back of the net. NSW scored late in the half heading into the break 1-0 up and then stuck again within minutes of the restart. The SA girls regrouped and put together some good passages of play which resulted in a goal to Kate Kourmouzis from Mt Gambier. The girls battled on to try to even the ledger but NSW scored again with the game concluding with a 3-1 score line.

The Boys Teams started their campaign strongly with a comprehensive 3-0 win over Fiji South. After a short break the boys then took on Fiji West with the conditions starting to have an impact with the game finishing at 1 all. The Boys remaining undefeated at the end of day 1 and Boys Head Coach Cristiano Dos Santos noted that he was happy with the result.

"The Fiji teams were very physical but I am pleased with the boy's efforts and results so far."

The Ultimate Fiji Cup concluded with success for all three teams. The Under 17 and Under 15 Girls both placed second while the Under 13 Boys completed the tournament in third place.

TIM CAHILL

Australian football legend Tim Cahill visited Adelaide in conjunction with the release of his autobiography 'Legacy'. FFSA was delighted to host an exclusive event with Cahill in which he sat down for a one-on-one interview with Channel 9 sports presenter Tom Rehn.



Discussing 'Legacy', his illustrious international football career and more, Cahill gave open and honest answers, delighting the crowd of close to 500+ people.

Prior to the formal interview, Cahill engaged with local footballers involved in FFSA's Visually Impaired program and an Inclusive SA team along with students from St. Peter's College, the host venue. Stating that it was an 'unreal experience', Cahill took to the mini-pitch with the children, also wearing a blindfold with the visually impaired group to gain a better understanding of the challenges the youngsters face. Cahill took to social media to state his enjoyment from the experience: "Thank you Adelaide for the love for LEGACY overwhelmed with the turnout. I want to share my experience today when I met a group of kids that taught me how to play Blind Soccer.

Today was so inspirational to see the kids embrace the game we love through the sound of a rattling football to know where the ball is. I tried so hard and it was one of the most difficult things I have ever done." "Today I spoke to a sell-out crowd of 500 people about the story of my career and helped to inspire kids and families to follow their dreams. All the money raised tonight went to the organisation to help send teams overseas to play football. #LEGACY" "I would particularly like to thank FFSA Game Development Manager John Mundy for organising and coordinating this event."

Futsal and Regional State teams along with Inclusive SA and SA Visually Impaired all had opportunities to raise funds through ticket sales to 'An Evening with Tim Cahill' with FFSA redirecting any further profits from ticket sales back in to Futsal and Regional State Teams.

ARSENAL CLINIC

From the 21st - 23rd of December Alan Sefton MBE and Daniel Rossetto from Arsenal in the Community visited Adelaide to demonstrate the Arsenal Doubles Club Program. FFSA has had a rewarding partnership with Arsenal in delivering a similar version of the Doubles Club called the Two Halves Program but this is the first time we have hosted the Arsenal in the Community team.



The response to the sessions held at Adelaide Shores Football Centre was so great that a third day was added on the 23rd which was hosted by Ascot Park Primary School. Across the three days Alan, Daniel and Gerard Rossetto, along with help from FFSA staff ran the Doubles Club Program which focussed on 10 and 11 year olds spending an hour in the class room learning literacy through a football theme and then an hour outside doing a practical football session. The aim of the Doubles Club is to motivate and inspire students using Arsenal and Football to show them that learning can be achievable, fun and rewarding. Over 60 Children participated in the program and many local teachers came along to view the sessions for possible implementation in their schools.

ARSENAL GAP PROGRAMME

In conjunction with representatives from Arsenal coming down under players over the age of 18 were given the opportunity to apply for the Arsenal Gap Programme. This programme allows for an exciting way to develop as a coach, work aboard and use skills to help local communities. Over the course of the Programme participants will have the opportunity to gain skills, qualifications and experience using football to benefit local projects both in the UK and at various destinations around the world.

Coach Chris Higgins noted that the performance was due to a tournamentlong commitment from his side. "It was a really great team effort, with the key factors being consistency and hard work throughout the week, leading to the reward of lifting the prestigious trophy."

FFSA Game Development Manager John Mundy was pleased with the display by South Australian sides as a whole saying "This has been a remarkable tournament for FFSA, with 7 of our 12 teams making the semi finals and with the Under 16 Girls also making the final, unfortunately going down 1-0 to New South Wales in a tightly fought encounter. Having Phillip Cash from Whyalla, a country boy, picking up a winners medal, confirms that there

are some great futsal players in regional areas and that there is an easily accessed, credible talent pathway through FFSA."

Cristiano's clinic focussed on the Skill Acquisition phase of the National Curriculum while Carl's clinic focused on the Game Training phase. Additionally, Carl, an ex Socceroo and Adelaide United FC player ran training for the International Soccer Club Seniors following the junior clinic.

A curtain raiser match between International Soccer Club and Apollo Soccer Club was held to support the charity beyondblue prior to the Round 6 fixture between the 2014 National Champions Metro Stars and Adelaide City FC.

WESTFIELD FFA CUP

Northern Demons engage Moonta, Yorke Peninsula

FFSA Clubs and Associations came together in regional SA, starting with Northern Demons and Moonta in the Yorke Peninsula. Taking advantage of a Bye in Round 7 of the FFSA Junior Premier League (JPL), Northern Demons U15's travelled to Moonta Area School to take on an Under 17 Yorke Peninsula side in a friendly match.

The game was played in excellent conditions, with perfect weather and a good surface - a credit to the Yorke Peninsula Association. The team have made notable strides in the format of their game over the past couple of years and the match was played competitively and in good spirit.

Northern Demons U15 Coach Steve Garden told that the club are strong supporters of regional football and providing pathways for players.

"At Northern Demons we see ourselves as a pathway for any player wishing to progress further in their footballing that lives in country South Australia, north of Adelaide. The Under 15's have players from far and wide. Whilst based at Port Pirie, players travel from as far as Whyalla and Jamestown; the under 14's boast a player from Ardrossan. The chance to play down on the Yorke Peninsula offers us the opportunity to look at players from that area and vice versa, for players of all areas to be aware of the pathway open to them."

The match between the Port Pirie club and Yorke Peninsula side was just the beginning of a quickly blossoming relationship between the regions.

NT soccer minnow handed FFA Cup lifeline by SA club

When soccer minnow Borroloola Cyclones lined up for their FFA Cup debut in the Northern Territory, they could thank a club 3000km away in Ethelton for helping them get on the pitch.

Port Adelaide Pirates came to the rescue when 20 pairs of soccer boots were stolen from the Cyclones' storage shed in the remote community, a 13-hour drive from Darwin. The fledgling club - the first all indigenous side to play in the national knock-out competition - would have been forced to forfeit the match if it could not find equipment to take to the field. Pirates collected and donated more than 50 pairs of boots and four training kits from junior and senior players. With the help of FFSA and Santos, the equipment was couriered to the Top End in time for the clash with Hellenic at Marrara Soccer Stadium.

Long-time Pirates volunteer Heather Combeer said players and supporters were keen to help a club in need, having previously donated boots to communities in Africa. "In this financial climate everyone is struggling, so if we can do something to help someone else out then why not," Combeer said.

Football Federation Northern Territory launched an online appeal encouraging soccer clubs across Australia to donate spare equipment. NT federation coach Mark Wakeling said the Cyclones players, who live in a community of just 926 people, were devastated by the theft.

"The reality of it is that we do not get enough sponsorship money each year to replace this gear as the cost of travel to each tournament is in the thousands, the players were stunned but with their outstanding character they bounced back and put their loss behind them and got on with the training for the big game."

In an interesting twist, the Cyclones are coached by John Moriarty, who played for SA club Port Thistle in the 1950s and '60s. Thistle later merged with Port Adelaide to become the Pirates.

I would like to thank all of the Game Development team, Tiarn Powell, Cristiano Dos Santos and Igor Negrao for their commitment and dedication in implementing new and existing programs.

Technical Director's Report

COACH EDUCATION

Coach education in advanced pathways has continued to assist in developing the current level of coaching which is outlined in a logical process through the courses. Coaches are equipped with the necessary tools and a solid foundation to reach their full potential. This is becoming common knowledge and as a result we have seen an increase in the number of coaches attending the courses, therefore improving the standard of coaching in our State and across Australia.

FFSA have increased the number of C Licence courses, (one prior and one at the end of the competitive season) to accommodate for the number of candidates willing to complete an advanced accreditation. Between the end of 2014 and 2015, over 150 coaches have completed C and B licences and 70 more have already enrolled for the February C licence course in 2016

The coaches can now have a more effective and positive impact in the specific areas they are working on, helping to raise the bar in the development of players and football in general across the state.

STATE COACHING CONFERENCE:

FFSA conducted the 4th Coaching Conference on the 15th November. This event is another great resource offered to local coaches as part of the education process.

The Conference was based around a review of the 2014 World Cup in Brazil and the 2015 Asian Cup in Australia. FFSA also had Adelaide United Head Coach Guillermo Amor and assistant coach Pau Marti as guest speakers.

2015 STATE TALENT IDENTIFICATION PROGRAMS (STIC)

STIC continues to play a major role in the identification and development of players in South Australia, in particular in the younger age groups coming through the Skill Acquisition Programs (SAP), with a direct link to the Identification pathways.

The program provided a large number of boys and girls with the opportunity to develop and learn in an environment that incorporates the different stages of development, which is a major factor with young footballers.

Players in this program are monitored by STIC coaches and FFSA Technical Department over a period of 5 months, whereby different stages of physiological changes and adaptation to training/game methods are experienced. This process allows all players the appropriate time to develop and confirm their abilities.

Programs Period:

- SAP: October to February
- STIC: April to August



STATE DEVELOPMENT SQUAD PROGRAMS

All the programs were full-time and consisted of 3/4 training sessions per week and a game in the FFSA competition.

- NTC played in the State League U18's
- U13's played in the Junior Premier League U14's
- U14's played in the Junior Premier League U15's

GIRLS

- NTC played in the Junior Premier League Boys U15's
- U14/15's Played in the Women's Premier League

Extra weekly games were organised against teams from other age group to support the individual development of players, particularly those who physically were not ready to compete at the same level.



Performances

It has been a very positive year in terms of both progression and performances. All our programs have worked towards establishing the FFA Playing Style, with the NTC and State squads, Boys and Girls, all representing South Australia very well at the National Championships receiving the recognition from the FFA Technical group, commending South Australian's Identification process and the style of football performed across all the age groups.

FFSA Competition

All our programs performed well throughout the year in the FFSA local competitions, with regular competitive games against an appropriate level of opposition which is vital in terms of development and evaluation of players.

Positive impact

FFSA also believe our programs have a positive impact in the local competition, by focussing on development of players ahead of results as well as playing a style of football that supports this we are able to encourage other clubs, players, coaches and parents across our football landscape to follow a similar method. The main purpose is to provide players with a consistent approach and the best possible opportunity to develop.

AFRICAN NATIONS CUP

The African Nations Cup is one of the most important events on the African Community Calendar. Football Federation SA (FFSA) have been hosting the event in conjunction with the African Communities Council of South Australia (ACCSA) for the past three years and during this time the aim has been to review and improve the competition each year.

Following a review of the 2014 event, the stakeholders requested that the competition be expanded to include quarter final games. As a consequence, the three day event was increased to four days in 2015.

The African Nations Cup was conducted across two weekends, 24-25 October at Burton Park and 31 October and 1 November at Elite Systems Football Centre. Round Robin Games were conducted across the first weekend, with the finals being conducted during the second weekend. In total 14 teams participated in the event, an increase of two teams from that of 2014.

The format of the competition consisted of two groups of five teams, and one group of four teams. The teams in each group played each other once. At the conclusion of the round robin games, the top two teams from each group progressed into the quarter-finals with the third placed teams from Group A and B also progressing through to the quarter finals. The winners of the quarter finals won through to the semi-finals with the winners playing off in the Grand Final.

Sierra Leone was crowned African Nations Cup Winners for the first time following a hotly contested final against defending champions Burundi. In a thrilling final that was a testament to the quality of the competition, the two teams put on a five goal thriller that had supporters of both teams on their feet throughout the game. Sierra Leone was crowned champions three goals to two courtesy of a hat-trick by Benjamin Kouakou.

In the curtain raiser game, playoff for third and fourth, Liberia claimed third spot from Ethiopia, winning two goals to nil.

One of the challenges that the communities have in participating in this event is the selection criteria for players to be selected into teams. The selection of players is at the discretion of each of the communities and as a consequence there were a number of players that were recruited from interstate. To address the integrity of the competition, Football Federation SA will be working with ACCSA to develop a selection criteria for player eligibility into the African Nations Cup for 2016.



CLUB CONFERENCE

Football Federation SA continued to host the Club Conference in 2015 with the focus being to provide volunteers and club officials with relevant information and tools that would assist them in their roles. Volunteers are key to the operations of clubs and associations and Football Federation SA is committed to upskilling and providing resources to enhance the development of clubs.

The Club Conference was offered free of charge to all affiliated clubs and associations, with an option for non affiliated clubs to attend by payment of a minimal fee. Once again the conference was supported by the Office for Recreation and Sport.

The conference provided a cross section of topics covering sport specific sessions as well as themes targeted to enhance the running of a club. In total seven sessions were conducted that included Use of Online Team Sheets, Social Media, How to Deal with Complaints, Risk Management, Succession Planning, AIA Vitality MiniRoos and Injury Prevention.

Over the course of the day in excess of 100 club officials attended the conference. The success of the Club Conference is highlighted not only through the attendance and feedback but with other Member Federations seeking to emulate the concept.
