Subject:	Smoke Free Policy	Date Implemented	April 2019

1. Rationale

Football Federation SA (FFSA) recognises that smoking is a health hazard and promoting a smoke free environment reduces the harmful impact of second-hand tobacco on non-smokers and helps to reduce the overall consumption.

Smoking is defined as any tobacco product such as a cigarette, cigar, cigarette or pipe tobacco or any product that does not contain tobacco but is designed for smoking including e-cigarettes and vaping.

Going smoke free is one of the healthiest messages a sporting club can share with its community. Outdoor smoke free areas make smoking less visible and less socially acceptable and provide a healthy family friendly environment.

This policy is required to be adopted at all FFSA sanctioned training, games and events. All members, administrators, officials, coaches, players and visitors that attend FFSA, affiliated clubs and associations are required to adhere to this policy.

This policy will be introduced at all FFSA venues for educational purposes in April 2019, with full implementation being required as of the beginning of the 2020 season.

FFSA commends this policy to all affiliated clubs and associations.

2. Policy on Smoking

This policy requires the following to be implemented;

- 2.1 All venues that are enclosed by fencing are smoke free. Patrons are required to leave the venue if they wish to smoke.
- 2.2 Venues that are not enclosed are to adopt a 10-metre smoke free zone from the field of play, junior players, food and all service of food and drinks.

3. Non-compliance

All Affiliated Clubs and Association will enforce the smoke free policy and any non-compliance will be handled according to the following process:

- 3.1 In the first instance an explanation of the smoke free policy is to be provided to the person/people who is infringing the policy; and
- 3.2 Continued non-compliance will result in the offender being asked to leave the venue by an official of the club or associations.

4. Policy Promotion

The smoke free policy is to be promoted by affiliated clubs and associations through the following channels:

- 4.1 Newsletters, E-News, notice boards, website and social media of FFSA and affiliated clubs and associations;
- 4.2 Displaying a copy of the policy at the venues of affiliated clubs and associations;
- 4.3 PA Announcements at events.
- 4.4 Smoke free venue signage at all affiliated clubs and association venues.

FFSA strongly encourages all clubs to actively participate in the Australian Drug Foundation's Good Sports program with an ongoing priority to achieve Level 3 accreditation.

5. Policy Review

This policy will be reviewed annually to ensure it remains relevant and reflects both community expectations and legal requirements.
