General Information & Nomination Form

GENERAL INFORMATION

1. Hall of Fame Principles

Football South Australia provides that the Hall of Fame Honour may be granted in recognition of services rendered to the sport.

The Football SA Hall of Fame recognises both on and off field achievements for eminent service or contribution in any area of football activity in South Australia

2. Process

2.1 Application Form

The nominator must complete the prescribed form detailing why the nominee should be inducted into the Hall of Fame. The form must be forwarded to Football South Australia.

2.2 Evaluation by the FSA Awards and Honour Committee

Nominations will be passed to the FSA Awards and Honour Committee (a sub-committee appointed by the Football South Australia Board). The Sub-Committee will consider each nomination and make a recommendation to the Board as to whether the nominee should be considered into the Hall of Fame. The Sub-Committee may request additional information from the nominator if doing so would assist its deliberations.

2.3 Final Consideration by the Board

The Board will consider the recommendations of the FSA Awards and Honour Committee and will either endorse or not endorse the nominee to be inducted into the Hall of Fame.

3. Criteria for the Hall of Fame

The system and criteria for the hall of fame induction process will be one level with two separate but equivalent categories for both "on the field" and "off the field" contributions.

- HALL OF HONOUR - Off the field
- HALL OF CHAMPIONS – On the field

Awarded for eminent service or contribution, either ON or OFF the field, in any area of football activity in South Australia. The Award is the highest recognition which can be given for a CONTRIBUTION or PERFORMANCE to the game of football in SA.

Outstanding contribution as an Administrator, Official or other non-playing capacity will be recognized in the Hall of Honour, while outstanding performance on the playing field in an SA representative capacity will be recognized in the Hall of Champions.

The Award recognizes a contribution or performance which is far above and beyond what would normally be expected of the player or non-player. This Award recognizes a non-player whose contribution has achieved South Australian State recognition and/or has been involved at a level of commitment and dedication seldom seen, or a Player who has represented Australia and/or South Australia at Senior Level on a significant number of occasions or a combination of other items.

This Award can recognize those persons whose contributions have been selfless in the development of football in South Australia from the grass-roots level upwards and who have earned the admiration and respect of those around them for the contribution to the South Australian Football Community.

4. Guidelines for the Hall of Fame Criteria

To be eligible any candidate must have performed their tasks and or functions while based in South Australia or having started their playing careers in South Australia have been of significant benefit to the game of football in South Australia by way of publicity and high-profile exposure in the game overseas or interstate.

- Ten, fifteen or twenty years as a member of a club is not a sufficient qualification on its own, it needs something significant and or out of the ordinary
- Being on the SASF or FFSA Board for ten years is also not sufficient on its own.
- Playing 200 or 250 games for one club is also not sufficient on its own.
- A combination of some or many items could prove to be satisfactory.
- A player who may not be eligible as a player may be eligible with a combination of player, coach, administrator etc.

Category, Hall of Honour – is for people outside of the player cohort.

Category, Hall of Champions – is only for players.

Some potentially eligible components

ADMINISTRATORS

- Office Bearers at Club or Association
- Chairman / President at a Club or Association for over 20 consecutive years
- Secretary at a Club or Association for over 20 consecutive years
- Member of SASF or FFSA Executive Committee / Commission for 15 years or more
- Office Bearer at Club or Association Level, senior, junior, Men's or Women's
- Member of a Club or Association Committee for 20 years or more
- Any charitable work
- Reporting for the Media, TV, Print, Radio / TV Broadcasting
- Manager of Teams – Club – State – National
- Trainer / Physio – Grounds-person – Bar Manager
- Foundation Members or any other awards in the game
- Individuals who may hold or have broken any record.
- Combination of all

COACHES

- Have been coaching for an extended period of 20 years! Plus, and or has progressed to higher levels.
- Has progressed into different fields, Senior, Juniors, SASI, Schools, NSL, State, National, Development, Instructor etc.
- Won a number of Championships, Coach of the Year and or other awards in the game.
- Holds or may have broken a record.

REFEREES

- Have been refereeing for an extended period of 20 years! Plus, and or has excelled in various areas, NSL, Instructor, Inspector, International games, State games, Cup Finals, Amateur League, Women's League, or FIFA Panel.
- Office Bearer of the Referees Association, Referee of the Year or any other awards in the game.

- *Holds or may have broken a record.*

PLAYERS

- *Played over 200 league games at Senior Level (Pro or Amateur) plus State plus National plus other items Player of the Year, Leading Goal Scorer, Captain of club or some other awards.*
- *If based on State games contender has to have played over 25 games or plus other items if less*
- *Captain of State or National team*
- *Holds or may have broken a record.*

5. Successful Nominees

If a nominee is successful in being inducted to the Football SA Hall of Fame, they will receive:

- A memento of induction as a Football South Australia Hall of Fame Inductee that will be presented at the Celebration of Football – Football South Australia Awards Evening.
- Invitations to selected Football South Australia events and activities

Notes to help you fill in the nomination form

- Nominees must have contributed to the game of football in South Australia, either on the field or off the field. (Administrator, player, coach, referee, state or club official, media & sponsors).
- Players **must be retired from playing at any level for at least three years** before being eligible for nomination.
- Non-players can be nominated even if they are still active.
- The Awards and Honours Committee needs as much information as you can provide about the person you are nominating.
- More than one person can be nominated but separate forms for each person are required.
