# PURPOSE OF THE NOVA YOUTH CLUB CHAMPIONSHIP (YCC)

The Nova Youth Club Championship (YCC) is a premier competition designed to bring together top-tier youth football teams, emphasising the holistic development of players, coaches, and match officials. At its core, the Nova YCC promotes a collaborative and respectful environment, ensuring the football community thrives collectively.

The Nova YCC recognises and rewards clubs that uphold best practices, focusing on comprehensive player development. This approach not only enhances individual skills but also cultivates positive behaviours that contribute to the overall growth and improvement of the sport, providing a clear developmental pathway for players.

The previous competition formats (Junior Premier League (JPL) and Junior State League (JSL)) often allowed players to move freely between competitions, leading to a blurred competitive structure. The Nova YCC introduces a clear and structured pathway, ensuring players selected within it follow a defined progression, fostering consistency and stability.

To reinforce commitment and reduce player movement between clubs, the Nova YCC enforces a regulation where players are restricted to one club per season. This change aims to ensure dedication to the club and maintain the integrity of the competition.

In an effort to further enhance the player experience, the Nova YCC introduces club incentives. These incentives reward clubs that implement best practices, such as player tracking, video recording, and meeting minimum coach qualification standards. By recognising these efforts, the Nova YCC encourages clubs to create the best possible environment for player development.

Football South Australia (FSA) and the participating clubs acknowledge their shared responsibility in ensuring a positive match day experience. #### THE ROLE OF A PLAYER

Match day is an opportunity for each player to express themselves and enjoy playing the game they love whilst contributing to the collective effort of the team. Players should always look and be encouraged to be brave in possession, have the courage to take risks and be the best they can be in the present moment.

Players should be role models for their teammates, opponents, and the community, their behaviour should reflect the club's values, fair play and the spirit of the game.

During matches, players should focus on their learning experiences, embracing the challenges presented in each match and possess a growth mindset always looking for opportunities to improve.

As representatives of the Club, players should foster a positive, respectful environment for everyone involved and take pride in representing their club, teammates and coaches.

Match day is for the players, let them play.

#### THE ROLE OF A COACH

The Coach is an important part of the game day experience but also the long-term development of the individuals in their care. The goal for all involved should be to enjoy game day and create a positive environment for all players to have fun playing the game they love.

The Coach should be the role model on match day. Controlled emotions and a supportive and positive approach always. This includes interactions with the opposition, officials and parents. Players often reflect the Coaches characteristics. You will often see players become irritated and argumentative if the Coach is displaying those emotions on the side-lines.

Players should be encouraged to express themselves and play without fear. We all make mistakes, and everyone will experience losing at some point. The coach's role is to help players learn and develop, encourage them to try their best and guide them positively through the challenging moments.

Coaches are encouraged to build a team around them to help create an optimal youth development environment with the support from the Club Technical Director.

#### THE ROLE OF A MATCH OFFICIAL

At Football South Australia, we are committed to creating a safe, respectful, and supportive environment for all our participants, including referees. Referees are an essential part of our game. Their role is to not only ensure that the Laws of the Game are adhered to but also to ensure players are safe throughout the match.

Following on from the launch in 2024, we are continuing to champion the 'Respect Starts Here' campaign, an initiative designed to reinforce the safety and respect for our young match officials through the use of bright orange armbands for referees under the age of 18.





#### THE ROLE OF A MATCH OFFICIAL

The bright orange armbands, worn by youth Match Officials under the age of 18, are a visual reminder that the referee is a minor and is developing their confidence and decision making skills each and every game.

Just like players, referees will occasionally make mistakes and, also like players, they will learn from these mistakes if supported rather than loudly criticised from the sidelines.

Things you can do to support referees - Get involved and lead by example:

- Say hello and thankyou to the Referee.
- Volunteer to be an Assistant Referee or Ground Steward. These roles help in supporting the referee with decision making and creating a positive experience for all
- Stop and Think Display the behaviours you would want others to show your child if they were out there officiating.
- Talk to your child about respectful ways they could respond to decisions they don't agree with or are frustrated by (walk away, deep breathes, etc).
- When discussing the game afterwards, instead of focussing on the referee's mistakes, remind your child and others about how referees are developing their expertise and mistakes are part of learning.
- Participate in courses (Laws of the Game, club Assistant Referee course or even JFMO (Junior football Match Official) to increase your knowledge of the role and perspective of referees.

By following these steps, you're not only helping create a safer environment for young referees but also enhancing the game as a whole.



#### THE ROLE OF A TECHNICAL DIRECTOR

The role of the club technical director is extremely important as they are responsible for the clubs vision and how it is being brought to life. Game day is the perfect opportunity for each club to show its best self and the Technical Director is there to bring everyone together.

Technical Directors should welcome opposition staff, players and parents and ensure everyone is safe and the environment in set for a positive match day experience for all involved.

Coaching the coaches should be a key focus of all technical directors on game day. Their support should be focused on the players learning experience and not influenced on the outcome of the game or be seen trying to instruct coaches to impact the result in any way.

The technical director should be an outstanding role model for the club and show positive behaviours for youth development for all to follow.
